





Bond Release A Map





Release A Contract Update

- The first \$30 million in demolition bid contracts have been awarded to seven companies.
 - All seven companies are small companies located in Detroit and each has hired a Detroit workforce of more than 50%.
 - City Council approved 12 of the contracts on 2/23/21. City Council approved the remaining 11 contracts on 3/2/21.
- Out of the seven contractors awarded contracts in Release A, the following two contractors have been awarded bond groups within District 2:

What To Expect?

- **Prior to Knocking a home:**
 - Contractors are required to remove any accessible hazardous/regulated materials
 - Hazardous/regulated materials removed from the home are properly disposed in a Type II Landfill.
 - Non-regulated waste removed from the home are placed behind the home, should not be seen from the street.
 - Once property is demolished, all remaining debris will be removed from the property.

What Abatement Should Look Like?



- Material is removed from the building and placed in the backyard.
- At the end of each working day, the Contractor must ensure that the sidewalks, streets, alleyways, and surrounding properties are free of dust, debris, and other potential nuisances.
- Material should remain in the backyard until the home is knocked.
- Once the home is knocked, all debris is removed from the property.

What It Should Not Look Like



- Materials should not be scattered on the side or front of a home.
- Contractor may **not** park container(s) along the street in front of an occupied structure.
- If you notice materials being discarded in the front or side yard of a home within your neighborhood, please report it to the Detroit Demolition Department at **313-224-4737** or contact your District Manager.

Prior to Demolition



3 calendar days prior to demolition:

- Contractor must distribute City-provided public health and safety materials (door hangers) within 400 feet of the assigned site.
- Contractor must place 3 lawn signs on the property notifying the public of the demolition.

Proposal N

On the November 3rd ballot, Detroit residents approved Proposal N for Neighborhoods, a comprehensive plan to address 16,000 vacant houses in Detroit through rehabilitation or demolition. Proposal N allows the City of Detroit to sell \$250 million in Neighborhood Improvement Bonds.

U.S. Calls for Pause on Johnson & Johnson Vaccine After Rare Clotting Cases

The Food and Drug Administration and the Centers for Disease Control will stop using the vaccine at federal sites and urge states to do so as well while they examine the safety issues.

“Based on the recommendation from the CDC and FDA, the City of Detroit is halting the use of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine until further notice. The city of Detroit’s strategy has always relied on the use of Pfizer and Moderna and has sufficient supply of both to continue to honor all appointments...This includes the Neighborhood vaccine clinics scheduled this week, as well as, the Northwest Activity Center. 




Number of Confirmed Cases by Date with 7-Day Moving Average


Number of Confirmed Cases by Date with 7-Day Moving Average

Indoor residential gatherings

Up to 10 people from two households are allowed and masks are required.



Outdoor residential gatherings

Up to 25 people from three households are allowed and masks are required.



Indoor public gatherings

Up to 10 people from two households are allowed and masks are required.



Outdoor public gatherings

Capacity limits vary depending on venue type, but never more than 25 people; masks and social distancing are required.



Travel

Avoid travel if at all possible; follow CDC guidance for traveling if travel is necessary.



Childcare

Masks must be worn at all times by everyone age five and older; guidelines vary for those between the ages of two and five. (See detailed guidelines below.)



Cosmetology and barber services

Masks are required at all times; customer information must be collected for contact tracing purposes; appointments are required.

Have You Been Fully Vaccinated?

The Joe Louis Greenway is a proposed 27.5-mile pathway for walkers, joggers, and cyclists. The Framework Plan finalized the route of the greenway, which was largely based on feedback from residents at 57 public meetings. The first phase of construction is from Warren Avenue to Fullerton Avenue, approximately 3 miles, and will start construction June of 2021 pending approval. Full construction of Phase 1 costs \$30 Million and includes environmental remediation, new parks, community hub and security camera network, walking and running paths, bike lanes, storm water infrastructure, and street furniture.


