Detroit City Council approves spending plan for federal COVID-19

Detroit - The Detroit City Council on Tuesday approved Mayor Mike Duggan's spending plan for \$826 million in federal recovery funds to address the negative impacts of the pandemic.

The mayor presented an initial proposal, dubbed the Detroit Future Fund, at the end of May to use the American Rescue Plan funds to address intergenerational poverty in the city over eight categories.

That plan was broadened last week as a result of two dozen community input sessions. The fund will cover grants for home repairs, vacant property cleanup, home down payment assistance, police vehicles, laptops and high-speed internet; technical support for seniors and students; and tracking of affordable housing for

The council, following an hour-long discussion, approved the revised plan in a 6-2 vote with President Pro Tem Mary Sheffield and Councilwoman Raquel Castañeda-López voting against it saying more time to review the budget was needed. The vote comes one day ahead of a deadline for the panel to sign off on a plan.



Renew Detroit will start with Detroiters' most urgent repair needs: new roofs



80% of all Senior Home Repair requests involve new roofs

- far and away the number 1 need in Detroit.

50% of Detroiters are turned down for home weatherization because of bad roofs.

Bad roofs lead to major home deterioration, including mold, insulation damage, sagging drywall, and structure collapse.

Renew Detroit is a 2-Phase Home Repair Program



Phase One 10/1/2021: Roof replacement for 1,000 homes





Phase Two 10/1/2022: Major repair for 500 additional homes

Renew Detroit – 3 Requirements to be eligible for free repairs



- 1. Homeowner is Senior (62+) OR is a person with a disability
- You have an approved 2021 HOPE property tax exemption, previously known as HPTAP (12,000 Detroit homeowners have exemption)
- 3. You have not received a City home repair grant of \$10,000 or more in last 10 years

RENEW DETROIT

Renew Detroit is a program that uses American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to provide free home repairs to qualified Detroit homeowners. This program will happen in two phases, starting with Phase I roof repairs. Over 1,500 homeowners will have a free repair through this program. This program uses the Homeowner Property Tax Exemption (HOPE) as part of its qualification process. HOPE is the tax exemption for low-income homeowners, formerly known as HPTAP.

Renew Detroit is not First Come, First Served. Home Repair Scores will be used to select applicants



The Home Repair Scores will be based on 4 criteria

- 1. The number of years you've owned your home
- 2. Level of HOPE property tax exemption
 - * lower income gets higher priority
- 3. Number of household members
 - * more household members gets higher priority
- 4. Already on a waitlist either on Senior Emergency Home Repair OR Weatherization deferral due to your roof

What if you are already on the waitlist for the old CDBG repair program?



- The old CDBG program has been taking names for a waitlist and currently has 1,961 seniors waiting for repairs.
 No more names will be added to the old list.
- Even if you are on the old list, you should apply for Renew Detroit if you need new roof.
- You will keep your place in line under the old list.
- Once you get your ranking under the new Renew Detroit list, you can choose which list is best for you.

The HOPE exemption has 3 major benefits



- 1. Reduce property taxes for this year as low as \$120
- 2. Get help from Gilbert Family Foundation for paying off past years' property taxes if you currently owe 1,600 Detroit families have already had back taxes paid off entirely.
- 3. Become immediately eligible for the Renew Detroit roof repair list if you are a senior or disabled.



If you are the Account owner....

- At age 62+, the WINTER PROTECTION PROGRAM applies. Services can not be shut for non-payment from Nov 1 March 1, however, charges will still accrue
- At age 65+, The Senior Citizen Provision Credit of \$3.75/mo applies to your electric account. No usage requirement applies, savings of \$45 per year. If you are already receiving a \$7.50 RIA* (Residential Low Income) credit on your electric bill, this will not be applicable (i.e. will not layer on top of the \$7.50).

Alley Lights

- When the City of Detroit transitioned to LED street lighting, alley lights were discontinued (but not removed) from the City's street lighting program.
- When an alley light burns out, there is an option to install a new light under DTE's OPL program.
- Streetlights are still under the City's PLA (Public Lighting Authority)
- A new light must be linked to a DTE account, with minimum of 5 year commitment (can be an account held by a non-profit neighborhood group)
- Cost for standard 64W, including tax is ~\$15/mo





NEIGHBORHOOD LOT

The new Neighborhood Lot program makes even more DLBA-owned vacant lots available to Detroit homeowners. Any homeowner within 500ft of a designated Neighborhood Lot that submits a plan for the lot and is endorsed by a Neighborhood Lot Endorser is eligible to purchase that lot for only \$250.




Up to 500 ft

FROM SIDE LOT TO **NEIGHBORHOOD LOT**

After a six month sales period, Side Lots that are not purchased by adjacent homeowners get converted into Neighborhood Lots. This means those lots become eligible to be purchased by homeowners within 500ft giving residents access to more DLBA-owned lots!


START WITH SIDE LOTS

The DLBA regularly makes DLBA-owned vacant lots available to adjacent and eligible homeowners across the city for only \$100 per lot. You can check to see if you are eligible for a Side Lot by visiting buildingdetroit.org/sidelots and typing in your own address.



WHEN SIDE LOTS ARE NOT **PURCHASED**

The DLBA encourages all homeowners to check their eligibility for Side Lots because vacant lots in this program will only be listed for 6 months before those lots will be converted into Neighborhood Lots.

2021 YARD WASTE COLLECTION



5800 Russell Street, Detroit • 313-876-0426

Collection is every other week

YARD WASTE - leaves, grass clippings, shrubs and twigs - will be collected every other week on your scheduled collection day.

Place your yard waste at the curb for collection by 7 a.m. but no more than 24 hours in advance. Yard waste is collected with a separate truck.

If you are unsure about your collection date, bulk collection limit or have any questions, please call your solid waste provider or go to www.detroitmi.gov/PublicWorks.

To sign up for weekly reminders, text your street address to (313) 800-7905.

DPW Paid Pickup

DPW offers affordable paid curbside pickup for bulk and yard waste items. If you have items that exceed the City's yard waste and bulk collection limits, call **313-876-0004** to request a quote.

To properly dispose of yard waste:

Only use paper, biodegradable lawn/yard bags or your own 32-gallon reusable plastic or metal container, which must be marked Yard Waste Only. The weight restriction on a 32-gallon container is 60 pounds.
NO PLASTIC BAGS will be collected.

Do not place yard waste in your refuse container.

 Twigs or branches less than 4 feet in length or 2 inches in diameter may be placed in yard waste bags.

Brush in excess of 2 inches in diameter should be tied and placed at the curb. Bundles should not be more than 4 feet in length, weigh more than 60 lbs, or be more than 18 inches in diameter. Leaves should be placed in biodegradable yard bags.

To be a good neighbor

Do not store your refuse or recycling can in the front yard

Your container is only allowed at the curb from 6 p.m. on the day before

collection and shall be removed not later than 9 p.m. on the day of collection

Do not place bulk debris in front of another structure or in front of a vacant lot. Place your bulk items in front of your household only.

 Do not mix yard waste, recyclables and/or refuse

Failure to comply with any of these requirements can result in a ticket being issued.



What you need to know about

BULK COLLECTION

Bulk items include Furniture, mattresses, appliances, hot water tanks, carpeting and large toys.

The City of Detroit is reminding residents of the guidelines regarding bulk collection. Bulk items will be collected on your scheduled bulk collection day every other week.

Place bulk items at the curb away from your refuse container, yard waste or recycling, by 7 a.m. on the scheduled day of collection, no more than 24 hours in advance.



Two cubic yards is about the size of two stoves.

Smaller items (clothing, toys, lamps, etc.) should be placed in plastic bags or boxes.

Carpeting should be rolled in bundles of no more than 4 feet and tied.

Place bulk items only in front of your household. Placing your bulk items in front of vacant lots or houses can result in a ticket being issued.



- Use the pickup service provided by the Department of Public Works. DPW will come out and give you an estimate on the cost of disposing of your bulk items. Call 313-876-0004.
- Rent a roll-off container from a private vendor and dispose of your items in that container.

You may take bulk items, yard waste or recycling to one of these bulk drop-off locations

- Davison Yard / 8221 West Davison
- Southfield Yard / 12255 Southfield Rd.
- J. Fons Transfer Station / 6451 E. McNichols

Detroit residents with proper identification may use the drop-off locations but are limited to 1,000 pounds per person per day. No construction debris accepted.

FAILURE TO COMPLY CAN RESULT IN FINES • Bulks items totaling more than two cubic yards or weighing more than 1,000 pounds will not be collected, and the homeowner will be subject to a fine of up to \$1,500 for first offense and up to \$10,000 for fourth offense.
